

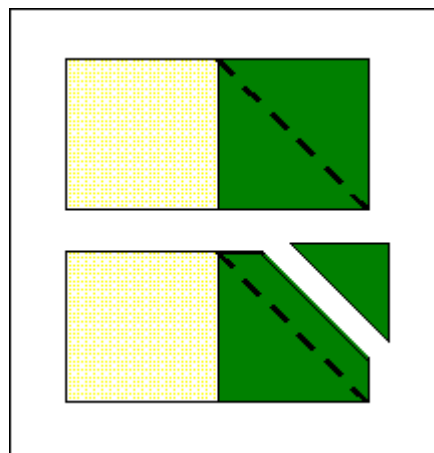
NOT ONLY, BUT ALSO CHRISTMAS

Part 2

Here we are at the next stage. As you look at these first instructions, you are probably saying - "What - more of those?" Yes - there are more of those, but they are a different size and just for variety—so that you don't get too bored—some other units will be completed also.

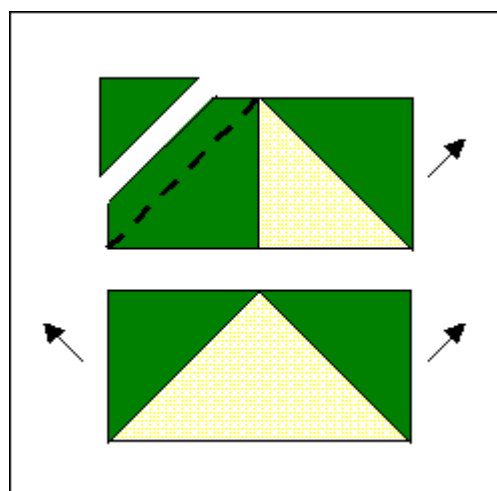
Section One:

Take 1 Cream $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and two $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Green squares. Draw a diagonal line from point to point on the back of the Green units - this is your stitching line. With right sides together stitch diagonally from the top centre to the bottom right corner as per diagram. Trim away excess fabric and press with seam behind the green fabric.



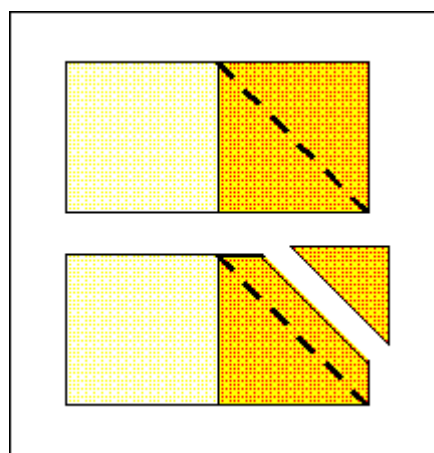
Repeat the above process on the opposite end of your background unit to achieve the unit as illustrated.

You need to make **EIGHT** of these units.



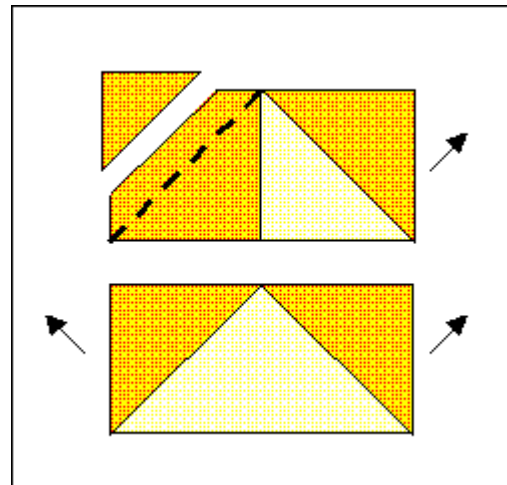
Section Two:

Take 1 Cream $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and two $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Gold squares. Draw a diagonal line from point to point on the back of the Gold units - this is your stitching line. With right sides together stitch diagonally from the top centre to the bottom right corner as per diagram. Trim away excess fabric and press with seam behind the gold fabric.



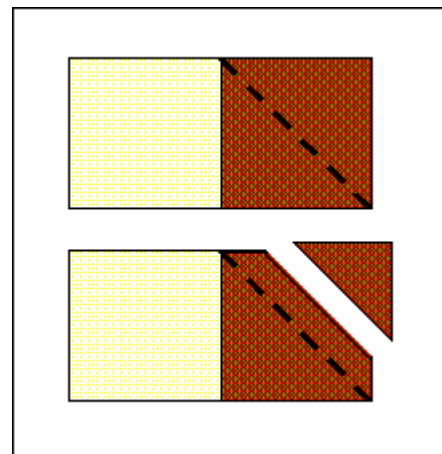
Repeat the above process on the opposite end of your background unit to achieve the unit as illustrated.

You need to make **EIGHT** of these units.



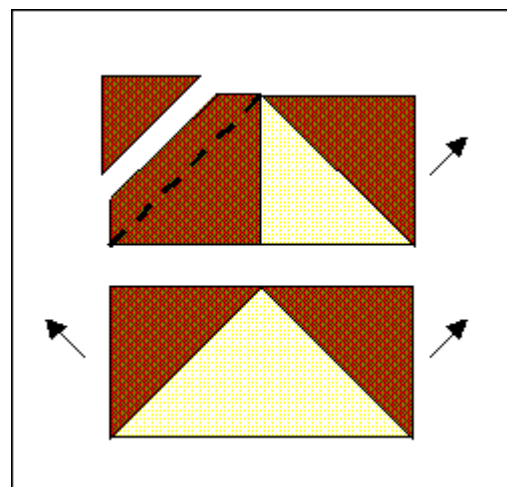
Section Three:

Take 1 Cream $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle and two $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Red squares. Draw a diagonal line from point to point on the back of the Red units - this is your stitching line. With right sides together stitch diagonally from the top centre to the bottom right corner as per diagram. Trim away excess fabric and press with seam behind the red fabric.



Repeat the above process on the opposite end of your background unit to achieve the unit as illustrated.

You need to make **FOUR** of these units.

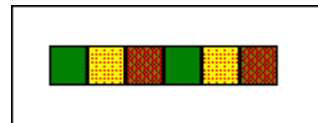
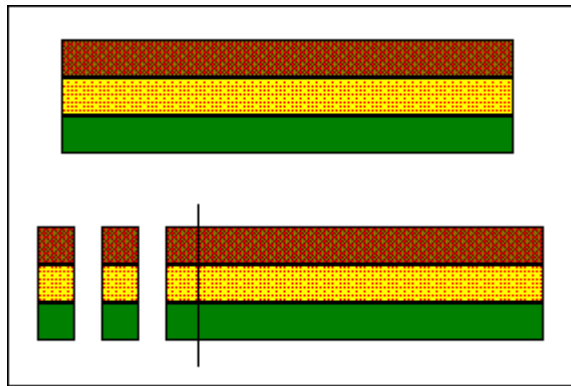


Next you will use three uncut 2½" strips of Green, Gold and Red. Join these strips from selvage to selvage following the diagram opposite - press all seams in the same direction. Once these have been joined then crosscut at 2½" intervals.

Cut **FORTY EIGHT** of these cross cuts.

Next join together two of these crosscut units so that you end up with **TWENTY FOUR** of the units pictured opposite.

Don't worry about pressing instructions at this stage for these sections.



Now for a couple of really simple nine patch blocks using 4 Gold $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ", 4 Red $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " and one green $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Follow the diagrams for the construction and pressing instructions.

You will need to make **FOUR** of these units.

Using the above units add one cream $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " cream rectangle to one side of the nine patch unit and then join the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " cream square to the second $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " before joining to the top

You need to make **FOUR** of these units.
